**2023 Membership Dues:** We would like to take this opportunity to remind our members that their 2023 membership dues are payable by January 31<sup>st</sup>. Regular membership is currently \$175 yearly and for our Life Members, yearly membership is \$86. **P2 Visas:** If you plan to apply for a P2 visa, please give yourself sufficient time for your application to be processed. Premium Processing is available if you need expedited service with a turnaround of about 25 calendar days. For Regular P2 Processing, please allow up to 90 days. Please visit our AFM National website for up-to-date information.

Live Performance Contract for Canada (LPCC): We strongly encourage our members to use AFM contracts. Our contracts are not only a safeguard against non-payment, but they also facilitate pension contributions.

Musicians' Pension Fund of Canada: You can check the current status of your pension contributions by visiting www.mpfcanada.ca You will first be required to provide your email address. Once your email address is on file with the Musicians' Pension Fund, you can request a temporary password to access the Member Self-Serve section of the website.

Please remember in order to be **vested** in the Musicians' Pension Fund of Canada, a pensionable employer contribution must be made at least once every 6 months for two years.

**PERKOPOLIS Membership Benefits Program**: Members can visit the Perkopolis website to access member savings. You will need to provide your AFM membership ID number when signing up. You can find this information on your AFM membership dues receipt or you can contact our office for your ID number. Value benefits include retail and shopping perks, exclusive travel and hotel pricing and more. More details can be found on pages 3-4.

**2023** International & Canadian Conference: Since our triennial International conference was cancelled in 2022, it will now be held this year instead. The in-person conferences will be in Las Vegas from June 23-29.

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#### Digitizing the Music Landscape: Transitioning to Live digital performances Interactive Workshop – Apply Today!

Presented by the Atlantic Federation of Musicians (AFM Local 571). A workshop training session made possible with a financial grant from the Canadian Performing Arts Resilience Fund (CPARF), Arts Branch, Department of Canadian Heritage, Government of Canada.

Background: The pandemic had an incredibly negative impact on musicians whose performance and business models have not included live streaming performances and those who have minimal digital technology experience/skills. Anecdotal feedback from mature musicians (40 years and above) who had limited digital technology experience inspired this education series. Investing in these musicians will go a long way to train, re-energize and bring new hope to freelance musicians to invest in themselves. As music has a long and valued role in our culture and economy, any opportunity to set self-employed musicians up for success and sustainability is a positive value proposition for everyone.

**Participant Eligibility**: If you are aged 40 or older and would like to participate in the upcoming training workshop, please complete the application and check off the date that works best for you. As seating is limited, (12 participants per session) we may not be able to place you on your desired date, so please select an alternate date(s) in **PART B** of the "WORKSHOP DATES". Please note each participant will attend only one session.

#### Workshop Overview:

Part 1- Getting Started in the Classroom. Didactic learning of the key concepts of digital platforms to host/post/record live music performances taught by video and audio technology professionals. Areas of focus will include equipment required (hardware, software, social media platforms etc.); proper use; lighting; audio/video set up; optimal physical environment; and camera placement.

Part 2- Practical Application Through Peer Mentoring (breakout sessions with up to three groups of four musicians). Each group will take the theory learned from Part 1 to 'bring it all together' by rotating through these three basic production stations: Set up (instruments/physical layout); audio and video. After the practical learning station portion is completed, each group will perform a recorded live stream

Workshops will be held in Halifax at the Music Room, located on 6181 Lady Hammond Road from 9:30am until 4:30pm. A travel/food stipend of \$95 will be provided to each participant.

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#### The Recording Industry's



The Music Performance Trust Fund (MPTF) is the world's largest sponsor of live admission-free, professional musical programs. MPTF operates as a non-profit, tax-exempt public service organization. From its New York office, it distributes funding across the US and Canada to support free admission musical events.

The fund provides for Live Music Performances which are free to the general public. It operates on a co-sponsorship basis between a co-sponsor and a Local Office of the AFM/CFM. The rate of funding is based on an individuals Local's Tariff of Fees.

Any and all manner of musical styles are eligible, provided the venue is free and open to the public in general. No commercial ties, special interest fundraisers, or alcohol sales may be connected with the performance venue.

Credit must be visibly displayed or orally given to the Recording Industries Performance Trust Fund and The Atlantic Federation of Musicians, Local 571.

30% MPTF co-funding available for general musical concerts


40% MPTF co-funding available for Hospitals, Assisted living etc.


50% MPTF co-funding available for school projects

**Musicianfest Programming**: Limited performance opportunities are available and fully-funded for performing in nursing homes and assisted living environments. Contact the office for details.

Please note: Requests for Project Funding are being accepted for the MPTF allocation year, which ends April 30, 2023. Be advised that the Fund no longer payrolls the engagements and acts only as a granting partner with the Principle Sponsor. Processing times have been as long as 60 days so please ensure you allow for proper timelines for approval.
